On Tuesday, 15 November 2022 and Wednesday, 16 November 2022 the Department of Community Safety (DoCS) hosted 66 Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) structures at a NHW safety engagement in George and Mossel Bay respectively.

The programme included presentations by representatives of the Western Cape Police Ombudsman and Western Cape Liquor Authority, the local municipality (George and Mossel Bay) and the South African Police Service.

Three structures received their accreditation certificates, one newly accredited in George and two NHWs were renewed, namely: Denneoord NHW (Renewal - George), Hansmoeskraal Community Forum NHW (Newly accredited - George), and HRF Vigilance NHW (Renewal - Knysna).

This brings the current number of accredited NHW's in the Western Cape to 550. The NHW Accreditation and Support Programme aims to provide support to NHW's to become sustainable and capable safety partners within Government and communities. It also acknowledges and recognises the efforts of accredited NHW's and their contribution to addressing safety concerns within communities.

Once approved for accreditation, each NHW become eligible for resourcing by means of a starter kit, free training and funding. DoCS supports NHW's to create a safer community FOR YOU.

On the 24 September 2022 the D block NHW in Wesbank hosted its official launch and Heritage Day Celebrations. It was attended by the Mfuleni and Sector 3 Community Police Forum (CPF), Religious desk of the CPF, Youth life Counts, Rieldancers, Cadettes and the Elim Group.

Thereafter the official programme commenced with representatives of the CPF to encourage community members to get involved in the NHW and become the eyes and ears of the community and being active citizens in order to combat crime.

This feature aims to address questions you may have about the running and operations of your neighbourhood watch.

What it is the role of NHW in terms of citizens arrest?

A citizen's arrest can only be affected in the presence of a police officer.

What programmes or training are offered by the Department of Community Safety?

The training provided by the Department are:

- **Basic NHW Training**
- Basic First Aid
- Basic Fire Fighting
- Training for organizational management
- Basic Training for non-financial managers
- Basic Training on conflict management.

The training above are mostly to capacitate NHW members to be knowledgeable on how to deal with the above and does not necessarily allow a member to be employable.

Can't areas with members from foreign countries get a translator when receiving training?

All our training is provided in the English medium of communication. All the material provided is also in English. It will be challenging to have training in many languages, which will prolong the training, which can become tiring.

Is there any way that the process of applying for accreditation can be simplified?

Yes, this has been the Departments intention to simplify the accreditation process, but we must follow legislation and ensure are compliant in following the proper procedures. However, we are in the process to simplify the process through our legal department.
